

NFCYM Collaborating Members – History and Timeline

Please note: Various terms have been used over the years to categorize organizations formally associated with NFCYM. Among these are ‘Liaison’, ‘Affiliate’ and ‘Collaborating Member’. Sometimes these classifications have been used simultaneously to distinguish organizations with different missions while, at other times, one term has replaced another.

There have also been several variations in how groups participate, including the exercise of voting privileges. Membership meeting documentation has not always made it clear as to which category was used at a given time or when a group transitioned from one classification to another. For the purposes of this document, each organization is listed by the year it was formally voted in, in whatever capacity. Whenever available, clarifying notes have been added.

Rather, plans were made to contact potential organizations to be collaborating members of varying levels.</p> <p>These groups were listed to be contacted and granted “shared communication relations” (voting rights): Salesians (of various provinces), the Youth Research Center, Boys Town, Central Committee on Conscientious Objection, and the National Youth Pro-Life Coalition.</p> <p>These groups were listed for non-voting liaison relations to NFCYM: TEC (Teens Encounter Christ), Youth for Peace, NECYM, National Catholic Vocation Council (NCVC), National Office for Hispanic Affairs, National Office for Black Ministry, and the USCC (United States Catholic Conference), and National Catholic Committee on Scouting.</p> <p>These are the groups listed for voting membership: the USCC, National Office for Hispanic Affairs, and the National Office for Black Ministry.</p>
